Read and Patrick Burns, City Comptroller made presentation to the City Council relative to the period ending 10-31-2014 and the Report shows that the City had spent 61% of the yearly budget and commitment 1 for Excise taxes has been mailed out in the amount \$7.4

million. Councilor Allen asked whether the City would have a surplus this Fiscal Year and Mr. Burns said revenue is seasonal but he concerned about snow and ice deficit as DPW has spent about \$1.8 over the amount appropriated but was on track for the FY15 balance budget and maybe a surplus. 11. Resolution (ID # 2979)

Resolution for the Western Mass Correctional Alcohol Center

COMMENTS - Current Meeting:

Read and an explanation was given by Councilor Walsh and Bill Christofori and Jim Gallagher representatives of the Hampden County Sheriff's Department, which runs the alcohol treatment center, said it is Sheriff Michael Ashe's priority to keep the center in Springfield, but the State has requested the bid be expanded to include surrounding communities and they must look at other possible locations outside Springfield for financial considerations. Mr. Christofori said that the Sheriff is working the Gaming Commission to get mitigation funds and program has been successful in 90% of the cases and has a staff of 64 employees. Councilors Walsh, Williams, Ashe, Concepcion, Allen and Twiggs all stated that they fully support the Western Massachusetts Correctional Alcohol Center and want it to remain in the City and preferably in the South End area and praised the good work of the Center and the Order passed by an unanimous voice vote.

(12.) ORD-2015-3 Casino Ethics Ordinance - 3Rd Step

Ethics - Chapter 38

Casino Ethics Ordinance

ORD. NO. _____

AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED THE CASINO ETHICS ORDINANCE TO AMEND the Code of the City of Springfield, Article I of Chapter 38 thereof, entitled Ethics, by inserting a Section 32.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SPRINGFIELD AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Article V of Chapter 38, Ethics, of the Code of the City of Springfield, is hereby amended by inserting a new Section 32 as follows:

Section 32. Casino Ethics Ordinance. Notwithstanding Chapters 268A and 268B of Massachusetts General Law and any other state or federal rule or regulation to the contrary, the following shall apply in the City of Springfield or any subdivision thereof:

- (a) No member of the Springfield City Council shall hold a direct or indirect interest in, or be employed by, the Region B licensee (as the terms are defined in M.G.L. c. 23k) for a period of 3 years after the termination of their service as a member of the City Council.
- (b) The Mayor of the City of Springfield shall not hold a direct or indirect interest in, or be employed by, the Region B licensee (as the terms are defined in M.G.L. c. 23k) for a period of 3 years after the termination of his or her service as the Mayor of the City of Springfield.
- (c) No employee of the City of Springfield or any subdivision thereof in a major policymaking position, shall acquire an interest in, or accept employment with, the Region B licensee (as the terms are defined in M.G.L. c. 23k) for a period of 2 years after the termination of employment with the City of Springfield or any subdivision thereof. For the purposes of this section a "major policymaking position" shall be defined as the executive or administrative head of any city departments and any person whose salary equals or exceeds that of \$60,000 and who reports directly to the administrative head of any city department or persons exercising similar authority.

COMMENTS - Current Meeting:

Read and an explanation was given by Councilor Allen that the Ordinance is to regulate the time individuals can leave the City and go to work for the new MGM Casino. The Ordinance prohibited the Mayor and City Councilors for a period of 5 years from the last date of employment from going to work at the Casino as the Mayor or City Councilor. The last section prohibits any City employees deemed "major policymaking position" which includes any administrative or executive head and any person whose salary equals or exceeds \$60,000 from being employed at new MGM Casino for a period of 2 years.

Councilors Twiggs and Williams spoke in favor of the time period as an issue of transparency and Councilor Williams asked Associate City Solicitor Wilson what is the State Ethic Commission time limit and Associate City Solicitor Wilson said that the Ethic Commission time period for 1 year and the 1 year period would run currently with the City 5 years time period and would not prevent municipal employees from gambling or eating at the Casino. Councilor Ramos said he would like to see the time period reduced to 3 years. Councilor Rooke spoke stating that he was not favor of any time period beyond State laws and the Council should not be preventing an employee from bettering his/her employment opportunities and we don't do that for any other businesses in the City. The Council passed 1st step and was referred to the Committee on Ordinances by a majority voice vote with Councilor Shea and Luna absent. Councilor Edwards made a motion to refer to the General Government Committee and was second by Councilor Hurst and the motion was withdrawn by Councilor Edwards. Councilor President Fenton asked General Government Chair Allen to conduct a meeting prior to final passage to accept amendments, if any.

Councilor President Fenton asked General Government Chair Councilor Allen to conduct a meeting prior to final passage to accept amendments and other comments, if any.

Read for the second time on February 11, 2015 and Councilor Allen made a motion to amend the ordinance by striking term 5 years throughout and inserting 3 years and was seconded by Councilor Williams and said motion passed by a majority voice vote with Councilor Fenton voting no and passed 2nd step by a unanimous voice vote and referred to the Committee on Enrollment by a unanimous voice vote. Third and final step is scheduled to be taken on March 2, 2015.

The Committee on Enrollment met on March 2, 2015 and found the ordinance to be properly enrolled and referred the Ordinance passage to the full Council and the Council passed 3rd step to be ordained by the following roll call vote.

ECOS Project Bond Authorization - \$4,019,991

Read and Rule 19 suspended and an explanation was given by T J Plante, CAFO that the Bond order is to appropriate \$4,019,991 to renovate the Environmental Center for Our Schools (ECOS) including an updated plant, a wheelchair-accessible dock and ramp, and a plaza, green technologies, including hydro-geothermal heating, ventilations, air - conditioning system and solar-efficient windows. Councilor Allen asked why the cost has gone up and Mr. Plante said that the original cost in 2009 was \$2.79 million but cost has gone up since 2009 and this is the cost in present dollars due site work. Mr. Plante said that approximately \$2.2 million in federal disaster aid and the other \$1.8 million will come from the City. Councilors Shea, Concepcion, Ramos, Hurst, Twiggs and Walsh all praised the work of Burt Freedman and Wilbur Cameron it keeping project alive. Mr. Freedman spoke praised the efforts of the City's School Committee, Mayor, Parks Department and the John Boyle O'Reilly Club for allowing fundraiser and read for a second time and the Order passed by the following roll call vote.

Collective Bargaining Ratification - IAFF - Contract #1

COMMENTS - Current Meeting:

Read and an explanation was given by Bill Mahoney, Director of Human Resources and Labor Relations and TJ Plante, CAFO that the Order is to approve the collective bargaining agreement between the City and the International Association of Fire Fighters 648 (IAFF) granted no increase for 2012 and a 2% increase effective July 1, 2013 retroactively; and a 2% increase effective July 1, 2014 retroactively; and a 2% increase effective July 1, 2015; and a 1.5 percent raise for a change in working conditions; a change to vacation policy where the total number of firefighters that can be on vacation at the same times shall be limited to 14; a change to sick leave policy; add a new section relative to education by eliminating Haz Mat payment and adding Emergency Management payment and \$500 for EMT Certification effective July, 2015; changes to FLSA; and the parties agreed to submit to arbitration on the issues of exchange of tours. Councilor Allen asked how the money would be paid for the contract and Mr. Plante said the total cost is about \$800 with about \$600,000 been set aside the Fire Department and a Council Order #15 for the additional \$200,000. Councilors Allen, Ramos, and Williams all expressed concerns about the lack of residency and length of time for the contract. Bill Mahoney said while the City has negotiated stronger residency clauses with some unions, it has never been successful through negotiations or arbitration with police or firefighters. Councilor Twiggs made a motion to move the question and was seconded by Councilor Timothy J. Rooke and said motion was later withdrawn by Councilor Twiggs. President Fenton left the Chair and Vice President Ramos moved to the Chair and after questioning Mr. Mahoney regarding why residency was not part of the contract and when was it put on the table for Union to accept and made a motion to table the matter so Mr. Mahoney could check his notes to see when residency was first discussed with the Union and was seconded by Councilor Williams and said motion passed by a majority roll call vote. Councilors Shea, Rooke, Twiggs and Concepcion said firefighters had waited long enough for a contract, and should not be further held up by the residency issue. Mr. Mahoney returned to the chambers and stated that the residency was put on the table on March 7, 2012 and March 6, 2013 and were rejected by the Union because of State laws. Councilor Concepcion made a motion to move the question which cut off debate and was seconded by Councilor Hurst and said motion passed an unanimous voice vote and the Order passed by the following roll call vote.

Casino Ethics Ordinance

ORD. NO. _____

AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED THE CASINO ETHICS ORDINANCE TO AMEND the Code of the City of Springfield, Article I of Chapter 38 thereof, entitled Ethics, by inserting a Section 32.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SPRINGFIELD AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Article V of Chapter 38, Ethics, of the Code of the City of Springfield, is hereby amended by inserting a new Section 32 as follows:

Section 32. Casino Ethics Ordinance. Notwithstanding Chapters 268A and 268B of Massachusetts General Law and any other state or federal rule or regulation to the contrary, the following shall apply in the City of Springfield or any subdivision thereof:

- (a) No member of the Springfield City Council shall hold a direct or indirect interest in, or be employed by, the Region B licensee (as the terms are defined in M.G.L. c. 23k) for a period of 3 years after the termination of their service as a member of the City Council.
- (b) The Mayor of the City of Springfield shall not hold a direct or indirect interest in, or be employed by, the Region B licensee (as the terms are defined in M.G.L. c. 23k) for a period of 3 years after the termination of his or her service as the Mayor of the City of Springfield.
- (c) No employee of the City of Springfield or any subdivision thereof in a major policymaking position, shall acquire an interest in, or accept employment with, the Region B licensee (as the terms are defined in M.G.L. c. 23k) for a period of 2 years after the termination of employment with the City of Springfield or any subdivision thereof. For the purposes of this section a "major policymaking position" shall be defined as the executive or administrative head of any city departments and any person whose salary equals or exceeds that of \$60,000 and who reports directly to the administrative head of any city department or persons exercising similar authority.

A BOND ORDER TO PAY FOR COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE ECOS PROJECT

WHEREAS, the City of Springfield wishes to renovate the Environmental Center for Our Schools (ECOS). Improvements the ECOS facility will include an updated educational plant, a wheelchair-accessible dock and ramp, and a plaza. Improvements will also include the incorporation of "green" technologies, including hydro-geothermal heating, ventilations, air-conditioning system, and solar-efficient windows.

WHEREAS, after reviewing this order, the Chief Administrative and Financial Officer has certified to the Mayor and City Council, that in his professional opinion, after an evaluation of all pertinent financial information reasonably available, the City's financial resources and revenues are and will continue to be adequate to support the proposed expenditures and obligations involved in the appropriation, without a detrimental impact on the continuous provision of the existing level of municipal services, in accordance with Section 2(f) of Chapter 656 of the Acts of 1989, as added by Section 1 of Chapter 468 of the Acts of 2008. The foregoing order requires a two-thirds vote of all members of the City Council, in accordance with Chapter 44 of the General Laws.

BE IT ORDERED THAT: the City hereby appropriates the sum of \$4,019,991 to pay costs of reconstructing and renovating the ECOS building, including the payment of any and all other costs incidental or related thereto, and that to meet this appropriation, the City Treasurer, with the approval of the Mayor, is authorized to borrow said amount under and pursuant to Chapter 44 of the General Laws, or pursuant to any other enabling authority, and to issue bonds or notes of the City therefore; that the Mayor is authorized to contract for and expend any federal or state aid available for the project, and that the Mayor is authorized to take any other action necessary or convenient to carry out this project; and

FURTHER ORDERED: That the City Treasurer is authorized to file an application with The Commonwealth of Massachusetts' Municipal Finance Oversight Board to qualify under Chapter 44A of the General Laws any and all bonds or notes of the City authorized by this vote, and to provide such information and execute such documents as the Municipal Finance Oversight Board of The Commonwealth of Massachusetts may require.

Purpose: The purpose of this memo is to provide an explanation of the order sponsored by the Mayor for the March 2, 2015 Council meeting, which authorizes the City to pay \$4,019,991 for improvements to the Environmental Center for Our Schools (ECOS) facility.

Background: Through the approval of FEMA, the City identified the Old Zanetti Elementary, in operation as a storage facility at the time of the June 2011 tornado, as an Alternate Project. Under this program, the City can take advantage of eligible FEMA funding to provide additional services to the community and upgrades to public facilities in a strategic and practical method, when restoration of the original damaged facility is not in the best interest of the public. The City chose the ECOS facility as a proposed project through FEMA's Alternate Project program.

ECOS has provided an exciting environmental education program for generations of Springfield residents. The 750 acres of Forest Park provide a classroom containing a treasure of environmental experiences. ECOS provides an activity-centered program in which students can expand their knowledge of the natural world by exploring the diverse habitats of the park.

Improvements to the ECOS facility will include an updated educational plant, a wheelchair-accessible dock and ramp, and a plaza. Improvements will also include the incorporation of "green" technologies, including hydro-geothermal heating, ventilations, air-conditioning system, and solar-efficient windows. Bids have come back higher than anticipated for this project, causing the project budget to increase. The budget for this project has increased; bids have come back with construction costs higher than previously anticipated.

- 1) **Effective Date:** This Agreement shall be effective upon approval by the Springfield City Council and the Mayor, and execution by the authorized representatives of both parties listed on the signature page below. An Order approving the Agreement was approved by the City Council on _____, 2015, and by the Mayor on _____, 2015. A copy of the Order is attached as Exhibit #1.
- 2) The City agrees to pay SWSC the amount of \$9,999.00 for the purchase of a 1991 Ford Tractor, Model 6610, with mowing deck and Motrim Boom Mower, VIN# BC95918, with an Odometer reading of 18,750 miles, as described on the "Bill of Sale", dated January 23, 2015, which is attached hereto as Exhibit A, and incorporated herein by reference. The vehicle is being sold in "as is" condition.
- 3) This Agreement, together with Exhibit A, represents the entire and integrated agreement between the City and SWSC. This Agreement may be amended only by a written amendment signed by the authorized representatives of SWSC and the City listed below, or their lawful successors in office or title.

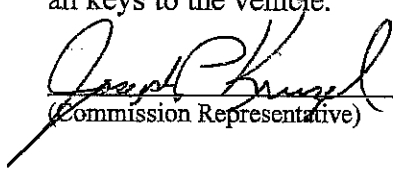

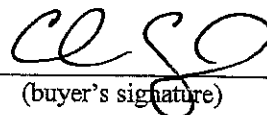
