Purpose: The purpose of this memo is to provide an explanation of the order sponsored by the Mayor for the November 29, 2021 Council meeting. This order is needed appropriate \$2,500,000 in FY21 Certified Free Cash as a revenue source for the FY22 Budget, and another 2,500,000 as a revenue source for the FY23 Budget, both as a means of reducing the tax levy.

Background: In order to reduce the size of the upcoming tax levies, and offer tax relief to the residents of the City of Springfield during an unprecedented pandemic, this order authorizes the use of \$5,000,000 in FY21 Certified Free Cash as FY22 and FY23 General Fund Revenues. This will allow the City to reduce the amount of its property tax levy by \$2,500,000 in both FY22 and FY23.
